We also encourage students to become course representatives and to take advantage of the many clubs and societies offered by the University and by John Moores Students' Union.

■ Partnership operates in an environment where everyone respects one another.

We expect everyone to treat each other with courtesy and consideration, whether they are students, staff or visitors.

Partnership works when everyone's contributions are encouraged and valued.

We recognise that everyone offers different, but equally important, perspectives, experiences and skills and want to champion and celebrate these.

■ Partnership requires a willingness to learn, adapt and change what we do.

Partnerships evolve and we want all students and staff to be open-minded to the possibility of change and willing to work together to improve the University's processes and structures.

■ Partnership supports effective learning where everyone works to the best of their abilities.

We expect academic staff to have expertise in and enthusiasm for their subject areas and we want students to take advantage of the wide range of opportunities available to learn with them.

Partnership between students and staff enhances subject knowledge and the learning experience.

We encourage students and staff to work together to acquire new skills and insights, as well as exploring new horizons and challenging received wisdom.

Partnership in research and inquiry advances subject knowledge and enriches personal development.

We want everyone to be part of a learning culture that promotes the interrogation of evidence through dialogue, debate, reflection and curiosity.

Partnership is strong when we take care of peoples' well-being and safety.

We urge students to keep us informed of any issues that may affect their learning, and make use of the wide range of support services on offer in the University and John Moores Students' Union.
